and reunite pets with their owners. This has already benefited the community by supporting responsible pet ownership and ensuring that lost pets have been reunited with their humans.

Following on from a successful launch we would now like to move to Phase 2. To purchase and add to the existing kit - a cat trap and a community noticeboard outside the White Hart Pub. The pub is the custodian of the existing Safer Paws kit and a noticeboard here would provide a central location for all the community to post missing and found pets.

I discussed with the SP team the possibility of acquiring a wooden notice board for the outside of the pub - I can make some space for this.

The community here in Wolvercote has already seen some great early results from this project.
