OUTLINE PROJECT DESCRIPTION Short description so others not associated with the project can understand its purpose and scope. Include aims & objectives, and expected beneficiaries (max 150 words)	The intention of this project is to fit sound absorbing acoustic panels to the ceiling of Cutteslowe School hall to reduce the ambient noise level at lunchtime and improve acoustics from the stage.
	The ambient noise level at lunchtime is so loud and disconcerting that over



70% of children on the school council considered it to be problematic. This is particularly acute for children with Special Education Needs (SEN) and younger children, so much so that the nursery children have to eat lunch in their classroom. The poor acoustics also mean that during events the audience finds it difficult to clearly hear sound projected from the stage. We were extremely grateful to receive funding for a new microphone and speaker system which has helped but the acoustics are limiting its full benefit being realised which impedes the ability to conduct meetings, performances and community events successfully. Above all else, the primary purpose of this project is to improve the environment for all the children, who use the hall on a daily basis, based on their direct feedback.



	The school business manager and headteacher have been consulted and are both very supportive of this project and the benefits it would provide.
RELEVANCE TO THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN How does the project enhance or develop our neighbourhood?	A significant proportion of the children who attend Cutteslowe school live within the Wolvercote Neighbourhood Plan boundary area as a large proportion is within our catchment area. This project is for the benefit of all the children and parents at Cutteslowe school in addition to the community groups who use the hall. The school will also be used by many of the children from the Oxford North housing developments.

We believe this to be good value based on the size of the space and hence the quantity of panels and installation required. Furthermore the supplier has many independent positive reviews.

There are no financial risks associated with this project. Acoustic panels have been supplied and fitted by this company to many public buildings including schools and village halls. Appropriate risk assessment will be carried out as part of the works.

The company selected has fitted acoustic panels to many community buildings with great success reported by the organisations and backed up by objective sound measurements. Success of this project will be evaluated through feedback from the teachers, children, parents and community groups who use the hall.

The acoustic panels selected for this project are environmentally friendly, the following information is provided by the panel manufacturer:

"Sustainability is the foundation of Ecophon's business strategy. The glass wool used in Ecophon's acoustic panels is created by combining natural sand and recycled glass to create an ecofriendly solution that is highly absorptive. Made from 70% recycled material, such as household glass and rejected glass bottles, Ecophon's goal is to achieve the lowest possible environmental impact across products and production processes, working toward reaching net-zero emissions by 2050."

Over the past 10-20 years there has been increasing use of acoustic panels to control noise levels in large buildings as the science has been understood and applied and these are now fitted to many community buildings. There is further information on the supplier website including many case studies in schools and village halls.

Cutteslowe school has a higher percentage of children on the SEN register than the national primary school average. It is a priority for the school to provide a fully inclusive environment to allow all children to



flourish. Considering sound levels is a key way for the school to ensure children and adults with sensory issues relating to sound can take part in school and community life as full and active members.
